#### POLISH EASTER CUSTOMS — OCTOBER 22ND

Fr. Czeslaw Krysa returns to All Saints Parish in Boswell with a presentation on Polish Easter Customs. Last year his dynamic presentation on Christmas customs was very well received. Fr. Krysa is presently the rector of St. Casimir Church in Buffalo, New York and is a noted authority on Polish folk culture. In addition to his theological degrees, Fr. Krysa holds a master's degree in Liturgical Arts from the University of Notre Dame and a doctorate in Sacred Liturgy from the Pontifical Athenaeum of Saint Anselm in Rome. For many years Fr. Krysa was on the faculty at Saints Cyril and Methodius Seminary in Orchard Lake Michigan. An author and educator, he has helped guide many in the Polish-American community to rediscover their family traditions through publications

and workshops on religious ritual practices. He is the author of an extensive book entitled *A Polish Christmas Eve: Traditions and Recipes, Decorations and Song*, and has produced a video series about Polish ethnic traditions. Father's presentation will focus on beloved Easter customs including egg decorating, food blessings, and devotional practices of the home and church. The presentation, which will begin at 6:30 PM, will include hot Polish food and drink at no cost. All are welcome, but are asked to register by phoning the parish (814) 695-5551 by October 18th.

#### NOVEMBER 1ST & 2ND - POLISH CEMETERY CANDLES

All Saints Parish will be providing Polish cemetery candles for All Saints & All Souls days. Since the earliest days of the Church people have visited cemeteries as the three Marys went to the tomb of Christ on Easter. Just as they went to anoint the body of Jesus, the tradition of burning oil or candles at graves is not only ancient but very common in Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Hungary, Croatia, and Italy. Such customs help us to pray for and honor the loved ones we miss. In Poland this custom is so widespread that cemeteries are illumined on All Saints and All Souls days to the extent that it looks almost like daylight (search "All Souls Day Cemetery Poland" on Google images). Over the years this custom has faded in the United States. As a sign of spiritual solidarity with the faithful departed, authentic cemetery candles from

Poland will be offered through All Saints Parish. The candles have a red glass globe and a lid that keeps them from going out. Some of the candle globes can be reused each year (replacement candles are available). Four sizes are being offered by the parish (\$8.00, \$12.00, \$20.00, & 30.00), and can be obtained by arranging pick up at the parish (814-695-5551), after Sunday Masses, or after Fr, Krysa's class on October 22nd. Prayer times at the parish cemeteries (Holy Family, Mt. Carmel, St. Stanislaus, St. Joseph, Sacred Heart, and St. John) on All Souls Day will be listed in the bulletin the week prior. All families are asked to drop off pictures of their deceased loved ones at the parishes prior to All Souls Day, the pictures will remain at the churches during the month of November when we pray for the faithful departed in a particular way.

#### SPAGHETTI DINNER – NOVEMBER 5TH

Since the early 1950s the parish in Boswell has sponsored a spaghetti and homemade meatball dinner on Election Day. In accord with the tradition that began at the old St. Joseph Church - and continues to this day - the dinner will be on Tuesday November 5th with serving times for both lunch and dinner. #### **RORATE MASS - DECEMBER 10TH**

Queen of Angels Parish in Central City will offer a Rorate Mass at 6:30 AM at their St. John site. Common in Eastern and Central Europe, a Rorate Mass is celebrated only by candlelight just before dawn. Offered in honor of the Blessed Mother, the interplay of light and darkness speak to the meaning of Advent and the coming of Christ as the light of the world. The Mass will be in English and Latin with Gregorian Chant lead by Professor Nicholas Will. If your soul is looking for a quiet, reverent, and transcendent place of refreshment, please consider attending.



#### CHRISTMAS - DECEMBER 25TH

Masses celebrated to honor the Nativity of Christ will be celebrated at 4:00 PM on Christmas Eve at All Saints, Holy Family, and Queen of Angels (Sacred Heart) Parishes. There will be Mass at 10:00 PM (with some Polish and Italian hymns at All Saints, Midnight at Queen of Angels (St. John – with Latin and Slovak hymns), and



10:00 AM on Christmas Day at Holy Family (no incense). Keep Mass in Christmas! Many thanks to the Benedictine Monks at St. Vincent Archabbey for covering the 4:00 Masses at Holy Family and All Saints on Christmas Eve. Oplatki for your holy supper will be available in each of the churches starting the first Sunday of Advent. In accord with the Polish and Slovak custom, Christmas decorations will remain up in each church until Candlemas day, February 2nd.

#### POLISH CHRISTMAS HYMNS - JANUARY 5TH

All Saints Parish in Boswell will host their singing of Polish Christmas Carols (known as Kolędy) on Sunday, January 5th, at 2:00 PM at the church (325 Quemahoning Street). Kolędy capture some of the finest sentiments of the Polish religious, national, and artistic heritage.



#### **HOUSE BLESSINGS - EPIPHANY 2025**



#### ETHNIC CHURCH AND NATIONALITY ROOMS BUS TOUR - JANUARY 11TH

#### M.B. GROMNICA - CANDLEMAS DAY - FEBRUARY 2ND

Most homes in Poland have at least one large bees wax candle known as a gromnica or 'thunder candle' stored carefully for special occasions. "Grom" is the Polish word for thunder, hence "Thunder Candle." This special candle is only lit for the most important moments in a person's life. Each year the candle is typically brought to church on Candlemas Day (February 2nd) in order to be blessed. If you are interested in purchasing a gromnica, handmade from locally produced bees wax, please contact the Boswell parish office (814-629-5551) or email Emily Marsh (emarsh@dioceseaj.org) by January 1st for more details. The candles will be blessed at the 10:30 AM Mass on February 2nd.

## PYSANKY EGG MAKING - MARCH 24TH

Decorating eggs is an art form deeply rooted in many Eastern European cultures. Using the wax-resist style of egg decorating, Beth Ott will offer a class on March 24th at 6:30 PM in the Kolbe Center at All Saints Parish in Boswell. Participants will learn the method of using hot wax and dye to decorate traditional Easter eggs and decorate an egg during the class. ## GORZKIE ZALE - MARCH 16TH - MARCH 30TH - APRIL 13TH

Gorzkie Zale (in English "Bitter Lamentations") is a Polish Lenten devotion consisting of three sung meditations on the Passion of Christ. The devotions will be sung in English at Queen of Angels Parish (Sacred Heart) on three Sundays during Lent at 3:00 PM. Each week there will be a guest speaker. Dr. Kathleen Borres will speak on March 16th asking the question, "What is hope?" On March 30th Fr. Eugene Ritz, postulator of the cause of canonization for Fr. Walter Ciszek, will speak on the heroic life of Polish-American priest who was imprisoned in Soviet prisons for 23 years. On April 15th Travis Moger, a married former Baptist minister who entered the Catholic Church and is preparing for ordination as a Catholic priest, will share his story. As a way to begin Holy Week together, following the devotions on April 15th there will be a free spaghetti and meatball dinner in the parish hall open to all.

## BLESSING OF EASTER FOODS – ŚWIĘCONKA – APRIL 19TH

The blessing of Easter foods, so deeply part of Eastern European tradition, will be observed at Queen of Angels Parish (Sacred Heart) in Central City on Holy Saturday at Noon and at All Saints in Boswell at 3:00 PM. The rite used for blessing is an English translation of the blessing approved by the bishops of Poland. An egg hunt for children follows the blessings.





This year the Easter Sunday 8:00 AM Mass at Queen of Angels Parish (Sacred Heart) in Central City and the 10:30 AM Mass at All Saints Parish in Boswell will follow the tradition of the Polish Rezurekcja Mass. Mass begins at the empty tomb, all present process around the church with the Eucharist while the bells peal and all present ring hand bells (please bring a bell with you if you have one). One of the most jubilant expressions of the resurrection of Christ as seen through the Polish tradition.

## DYNGUS DAY - APRIL 26TH

The Polish day of merriment, Dyngus Day, will be celebrated at Queen of Angels Parish on Saturday April 26th. Tickets go on sale March 6th (tickets sold-out in 38 minutes last year).
